Col. Theodore Roosevelt Jr. at a caucus of American
Expeditionary Force in Paris
France the American Legion was born. This was March 15 – 17, 1919. An organizational caucus was held in St. Louis, MO. May 8 – 10, 1919

The American Legion was named at the caucus in Paris. Maurice K. Gordon, then a major in the 36th Division made the successful motion for the name as a result of a controversy that had developed over the name.

The AEF delegates wanted to create an association of veterans whose primary devotion was to God and Country. One of their goals was dedicated to fair and equitable treatment for all veterans, particularly the disabled, and the widows and orphans whose loved ones paid the ultimate price of freedom.

Theodore Roosevelt Jr. won the affectionate title, "Father of The American Legion" as a result of his unwavering service.
