During our January meeting, I told the story of an Iraqi War Veteran who was having an extremely difficult time. He suffered a stroke, which the doctors attributed to chemicals used in chemical warfare. He couldn't work, had mounting bills, and really needed help.

He had applied to the VA for benefits due him because of a service connected disability. And we all know how fast the VA is with claims.

He needed help and fast. He went to various veterans organizations and then, finally, ended up talking to our American Legion. Through the Temporary Financial Assistance program, he received the money needed to pay his back bill (rent, utilities, food, etc). Meanwhile, the VA continued to drag its feet, and the Christmas Holidays were fast approaching.

He called me asking for help. He wanted to take his three year old son to see his family in Wisconsin. We had just had our monthly meeting, and there were various other things going on

where it would probably taken several days for us to get him help. I know our post would have come through with flying colors to assist. But, thinking of the fastest way to provide assistance, I immediately thought of the VFW. It was their meeting night.

I asked him to come to the VFW meeting that night. Prior to the meeting I introduced him to Commander Haney. He explained the situation to Commander Haney.

During the meeting, the members there voted unanimously to help. Several members even handed him cash while the Quartermaster was writing out the check.

The reason I tell this story is to show, that by working together, how much more both of our great organizations can and do accomplish. I see no reason for thinking that by working together either of our organizations could possibly lose its identity. Both organizations consist of honorably discharged veterans who served during wartime. Both organizations have the exact same goals, ideals, and purpose for existence.

Think of all the possible projects a combined effort could produce.

Included in this newsletter is a summary of the activities that our post performed last year. We can be proud of all that we did. To me, the most impressive accomplishments were those of the honor guard and the flag etiquette classes. Mike Edwards has done and is doing a wonderful job with both these groups.

Thanks to Mike and his team 44 deceased veterans were awarded the military funeral honors they so deserved. Whenever called upon, our fellow Legionnaires are there, no matter how hot or how cold.

Eighteen classes on Flag Etiquette were presented to the various elementary schools in the area. Over 739 students and teachers were present. The letters received from the students give us a sense of pride that is hard to out do. Thanks Comrades!

### **RETIREE MEDAL WEARING POLICY**

Source: Army Echoes Jan-Apr 07  
Secretary of Veterans Affairs  
Jim Nicholson recently urged  
veterans to show pride in their  
service by wearing their medals  
on Veterans Day. He said he  
hoped this display of military  
decorations, which he called the  
"Veterans Pride Initiative,"  
would become a traditional part  
of Veterans Day, Memorial Day,  
the Fourth of July and other  
patriotic observances.

Guideline for wearing awards  
are found in Army Regulation  
670-1, Wear and Appearance of  
Army Uniforms and Insignia,  
retired Soldiers which states, "...  
retired soldiers may wear all  
categories of medals (described  
in this regulation) on appropriate  
civilian clothing. This includes  
clothes designed for veteran and  
patriotic organizations on  
Veterans Day, Memorial Day,  
and Armed Forces Day, as well  
as at formal occasions of  
ceremony and social functions of  
a military nature. Personnel may  
wear either full-size or miniature  
medals. Personnel who wear  
medals on civilian clothes should  
place the medals on the clothing  
in approximately the same

location and in the same manner  
as on the Army uniform, so they  
look similar to medals worn on  
the Army uniform."

## **What are the Eligibility Requirements for the Vietnam War Veterans' Award**

Veteran served on active  
duty in the United States  
military service during the  
period of February 28, 1961  
to May 7, 1975.

Veteran was honorably  
separated or discharged from  
military service, is currently  
in active service in  
honorable status, or was in  
active service in an  
honorable status at the time  
of his or her death.

Veteran is a legal resident  
of Missouri on August 28,  
2006 or was a legal resident  
of Missouri at the time he or  
she entered or was  
discharged from military  
service or a legal resident of  
Missouri at the time of his or  
her death.

The Vietnam War medal,  
medallion, and certificate  
shall be awarded regardless  
of whether or not such  
veteran served within the  
United States or in a foreign  
country.

## **USS New York**

It was built with 24 tons of  
scrap steel from the World Trade  
Center.

It is the fifth in a new class of  
warship - designed for missions  
that include special operations  
against terrorists. It will carry a  
crew of 360 sailors and 700  
combat-ready Marines to be  
delivered ashore by helicopters  
and assault craft.

Steel from the World Trade  
Center was melted down in a  
foundry in Amite, LA to cast the  
ship's bow section. When it was  
poured into the molds on Sept. 9,  
2003, "those big rough  
steelworkers treated it with total  
reverence," recalled Navy Capt.  
Kevin Wensing, who was there.  
"It was a spiritual moment for  
everybody there."

Junior Chavers, foundry  
operations manager, said that  
when the trade center steel first  
arrived, he touched it with his  
hand and the "hair on my neck  
stood up." "It had a big meaning  
to it for all of us," he said. "They  
knocked us down. They can't  
keep us down. We're going to be  
back."

The ship's motto? "Never  
Forget"

### **CHERISH OUR CHILDREN**

(This applies to all of us, whether or not we have been parents of children)

Parents, can you remember when your children were born and after cleaning up the little one, the Doctor or Nurse wrapped the infant in a blanket and handed it to you. Remember the joy, the awe, the tears as you received this gift of life crying for the first time in this world. Do you recall how fragile that life seemed, how delicate, how precious?

Now move forward 12 or 14 months. You have cleaned up messes, been thrown up on, lost who knows how many hours of sleep, spent hours at the Doctor's office frantic because of a fever that won't respond to normal treatment. On the down side, you would agree with the person who described a baby as 'a digestive apparatus with a loud noise at one end and no responsibility at the other.' But on the positive side, you are humbled by this helpless little creation that needs you in every area.

Somewhere between infancy and the teen years, many of us lose that sense of awe, that sense of preciousness we felt when we first received our child in the delivery room. For many the child becomes a burden, a bother, a recipient of our anger and frustration at things the child in no way caused. If a divorce has occurred the children may have even become pawns between the mother and father, or be treated as a piece of property to be exchanged every other weekend.

In an era when 1.1 million teens become pregnant each year, when one out of four children face a risk of being sexually or physically abused by the time they reach 18, when 20% of those hospitalized for depression are under the age of 18. It is time that we learn once again how to cherish all children whether they belong to us or someone else. And there is no better model that our Lord Jesus Christ who holds every child in high esteem.

It isn't that our Lord treats children differently than He treats anyone else, but what is significant is that He treats them as special as everyone else. They

are no less important and deserving of His love and attention merely because they are young. He esteems them as he esteems the poor, or the Samaritan Woman, or the tax collector, or the common fisherman. And it is this value He placed upon their worth that we have lost sight of today in many ways. It is easy for the children to become a burden and source of stress rather than a source of blessing. When they are hurting we tell them to grow up or stop that crying, or we'll give them something to cry about. We are crushing the very spirit that God gave them, which makes them special.

One gift that Jesus gave everyone, including the children, was that no one's pain is unimportant. Jesus takes time to stop what He is doing and cares for our pains. Likewise, we are to do the same even if we have pains of our own.
